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The 21st century skills call for creative thinking that seeks innovative solutions in life and education.

The development of creative abilities is vital to survive. Teaching in a creative way is essential to make learning a process that all students can enjoy and benefit from.
Embedding the arts into school curriculum is a major answer to this need.

The arts create a highly stimulating learning environment and teachers use materials, tools and strategies that increase sensory inputs.

e-ARTinED aims at creating innovative didactic tools to enable teachers to use multiple art forms to teach curricular subjects. For instance: teaching maths through sculpture, chemistry through dance, history with painting, science with music, geography with drama.

e-ARTinED expands the research and the resources created in the ARTinED project 2011.

ARTinED was extremely successful and received praise by the experts of the European Commission.

e-ARTinED organizes the previous didactic materials in a systematic didactic set, expanding on three new subjects: "Social inclusion through the arts", "Exploring nature through the arts" and "New Media Arts".

Collective piloting events will help to test and evaluate the new resources.

e-ARTinED will create and deliver a 4-month e-distance Course for teachers across Europe.

Through the e-Course, teachers will experiment the project inspiring methodology and tools.

The e-ARTinED Community of Practice will also be created and will contribute in a substantial way to the project sustainability.
